







Timing and available budget

- When will the Call for proposals 2011 be published?
 - Estimated for early October 2011, once Commission Decision adopted
 - Open 3,5 months till 16 January 2012
 - Delays in the publication of the call due to new political priorities to be brought in the work programme and the call text
- Available Marco Polo budget for the Call 2011?
 - > 56,87 M € to finance around 30 projects







MARCO POLO Call 2011 - Preliminary planning Deadline for proposals: 16 January 2012 Opening session: 1st week February 2012 Evaluation by external experts (3 weeks): from 4th week February 2012 **Evaluation Committee EACI:** April 2012 ■ List of proposed projects to be funded (to MOVE): May 2012 Start and end of negotiations: June - September 2012 Legislative procedure: 4th quarter 2012 Nov - Dec 2012 Signature contracts by EACI : eaci



Political priorities of call 2011

- <u>NB draft text of the revised WP 2011– not yet adopted</u> by the Commission
- Political priorities translated into operational objectives for the Marco Polo programme
 - SSS-MoS projects reducing polluting emissions of maritime transport (low sulphur fuels, LNG powered vessels etc.) max 10% of the budget
 - Inland Waterway Transport max 10 % of the budget
 - Single Wagon Load Traffic lower min modal shift threshold: 30 M tkm











Maritime projects in the call 2011



- Revised <u>draft</u> WP after consultation with stakeholders:
- No more specific eligibility criteria for SSS-based Modal shift, Motorways of the Sea and Catalyst actions
 - Open for all SSS and MoS projects but:
 - 10% financial priority in the budget and extra points can be given if reducing polluting emissions- low sulphur fuels, LNG etc.)
 - Possible unacceptable distortion of competition a concern in particular in the maritime sector – special evaluation process put in place -> eligibility criteria !!!





